Call for Applications 2019-2020 Graduate Teaching Assistantships

Due by Monday, March 18, 2019

The Institute for Women's Studies welcomes applications for graduate teaching assistantships. We seek graduate instructors who are prepared to teach WMST 1110: Multicultural Perspectives on Women in the US and/or WMST 2010: Introduction to Women's Studies. There is also the possibility of a Writing Intensive TA position.

A complete application will include:

1. A cover letter detailing your interest in teaching for IWS
2. A completed application form (see attached)
3. A current CV
4. Relevant information from previous teaching evaluations
5. An unofficial copy of your UGA transcript
6. Two letters of reference, including one from your major professor

Application materials should be submitted as a single PDF document to iwsgrad@uga.edu no later than March 18, 2019. (Letters may be included in your packet or sent directly to iwsgrad@uga.edu.)

5. Are there any specific considerations that would affect when you could teach or how much involvement you could have in the Institute for Women's Studies? (e.g., commuting long distances, working other jobs, finishing dissertation, etc.)

6. GTAs will be expected to attend a limited number of mandatory organizational meetings, regularly attend the Friday Speaker Series and other events, and participate in the organization of the annual student symposium. Will you commit to participating in this regard?
7. Depending on enrollment, GTAs may also be required to take our 7770 course. Are you willing to do so? For our records, have you taken a 7770 course in another discipline?
